

Magical Easter

Easter is around the corner and the holidays are upon us. The kids need entertaining. What better way to spend time than bonding over some magical eggy activities!

What you will need:

Easter egg dyeing and hunt

Prepare an Easter egg hunt with your very own decorated eggs.

- 1. Boil eggs in a pot for about 10-12 minutes.
- 2. Drop 5-10 drops of desired food colouring in each cup.
- 3. Pour and mix half a cup of boiling water and 1 teaspoon of vinegar into the cups.
- 4. Place the hard-boiled eggs in the cups and leave for 5 minutes.
- 5. Remove the eggs from the cups and leave to dry on a tray.
- 6. When fully dried, hide them and let the hunt begin.
- 7. You could even decorate them to your liking.

What you will need:

Egg eruption!

Create your own eggy surprise. It's a great opportunity to have a small lesson about natural disasters as well.

- 1. Empty a box of baking soda into a big bowl.
- 2. Add water into the bowl a small amount at a time until you get a moldable but not runny dough that holds its shape when pressed together. If it is too runny, just add baking soda until you get the desired texture.
- 3. Pack the mixture into the bottom half of the plastic egg first and add a few drops of desired food colouring in the middle.
- 4. Place toy on top and pack in more mixture around the toy.
- 5. Fill the other half of the egg with the mixture and close the two halves together firmly.
- 6. Gently lift off the top of the egg and check if you need to add in more mixture and firmly close it.
- 7. Place it in the freezer for about 10-20 minutes for it to hold its shape.
- 8. Prepare about half a cup of vinegar in a transparent plastic cup.
- Remove the egg from the freezer and drop it into the cup!
 Place the cups on a tray to make cleaning easier. Be prepared for the messy eruption! Enjoy!

Plastic eggs

- Vinegar
- 1 small box baking soda
- Food colouring
- Water
- Bowl
- Spoon
- Small toy e.g.
 Lego, marble etc



What you will need:

Humpty Dumpty's happy herb garden

Reuse your empty egg shells and create yummy edible garden! Thrown in a lesson about sustainability as well.

- Eggshells
- Seeds or seedling of herbs of choice
- Markers for decoration
- Potting mix soil
- Water
- Spoon

- 1. Clean eggshells thoroughly with water. Dry it for day.
- Decorate eggshells with markers by drawing silly faces and naming them.
- 3. Scoop about 2-3 spoonful of soil and wet the soil with a spoonful of water.
- 4. Dig a hole with your finger and place seeds or seedlings into the soil.
- 5. Cover up with another spoonful of soil.
- 6. Place the plant near the window or any place where there is sun and watch it sprout and grow.
- 7. Voila! Humpty's herb garden is on its way! Have fun planting.



What scrumptious treats will you whip up with your eggy herbs?



What you will need:

- 10 popsicles sticks
- 6 rubber bands
- 1 bottle cap
- Double sided tape

Easter catapault

This is a great family activity which can keep the little ones entertained for hours..

- 1. Put 8 sticks in a bundle and tie both ends together.
- 2. Tie the remaining two popsicle sticks together on one end and fix to the middle of the other popsicle bundle as shown below.
- 3. Tie a criss-cross with the rubber bands to fix the popsicle sticks in place.
- Lastly, glue the bottle cap on as shown below and place a plastic egg on the bottle cap. See how far it can go!
