Exploring with texture

Give your little ones senses an opportunity to feel and explore painting on different textures.

- 1. Lay a white sheet or newspaper to cover the floor for easy clean up.
- 2. Place the bubble wrap, sand paper and tissue on the floor and stick them down with tape. Make sure it is secure.
- 3. Pour paint of different colours and off you go! All set and ready for messy play!
- 4. Your children will have a great time using their hands and feet to explore painting on different textures.

Get their senses exploring!!!



What you will need:

- Paint
- Bubble wrap
- Sand paper
- Tissue
- Tape

What you will need:

• Water gun

- Art block
- Food colouring
- Water

Water gun painting

Let's get those little ones creating masterpieces.

- 1. Tape the art paper up in a preferred area.
- 2. Mix a few cups of water with different food colouring.
- 3. Fill the water gun with the mixture. And you are set! Have fun shooting and creating little master piece



What you will need:

Playdough / clay

- Vinegar
- Baking soda
- Food colouring

Volcano!

This is a great science activity, really simple to set up but is lots of fun.

- 1. Mould the playdough or clay into the shape of a cone.
- 2. Put in a few tablespoons of baking soda.
- 3. Mix a small cup of vinegar with a few drops of food colouring.
- 4. Pour the mixture in AND BOOM!!!



And Boom it goes!

What you will need:

Bubble painting

A super fun way to get messy and create beautiful textured artwork.

- 1. Lay mahjong paper or art block out in your preferred area.
 - 2. Add food colouring to the bubbles and mix.
 - 3. Get your child to blow bubbles downwards, onto the paper.
 - 4. That's it! Watch the bubbles create a beautiful art piece! I am sure you will be impressed with the creation!
